SAN LORENZO VALLEY WATER DISTRICT HOSTS FINAL COMMUNITY WORKSHOP TO PRIORITIZE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

WHAT & WHY:

The San Lorenzo Valley Water District will host its final community workshop to prioritize the capital improvement program (CIP) projects that will be undertaken in the next decade. This is the fourth and final of a series of community workshops SLVWD has hosted over the past nine months about the CIP projects.

The workshop will review ranked projects based on criteria that has been developed at earlier CIP community meetings to create a list of the most-important infrastructure work within the District. Projects include repair, replacement and improvement of current infrastructure.

Following this workshop, the District will work to determine how much will be spent annually on CIP projects. A rate study will follow to determine how the infrastructure maintenance needs will be funded.

From input received at the workshops, the District will create one, five and 10-year Capital Improvement Plans.

The meeting is open to all community members and attendance is encouraged for public input.
