The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the San Lorenzo Valley Water District was called to order by Dir. Rapoza on Thursday, August 7, 2003 in the District's Operations Building, 13057 Highway 9, Boulder Creek, California at 7:31 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Initial Study and Notice of Environmental Review Hansen Aggregates Mid-Pacific, Inc.

Manager Mueller reported that the District has been noticed that Santa Cruz County received an application from Hansen Aggregates Mid-Pacific, Inc. (formerly Kaiser Sand & Gravel Company) for a five (5) year review of their mining operations. Santa Cruz County conducted an Initial Study and prepared a Notice of Environmental Review relative to the subject application. Manager Mueller stated that the project consists of a five (5) year review of their existing mining operations and a Mining Approval Amendment to include changes to the mining plan, reclamation plan and financial assurance. The final reclamation plan includes a proposed storm water retention basin which has the potential to benefit public and private water supply. A hydrogeologic study prepared for Hansen Aggregate by Weber, Haynes and Associates, concluded that, surface water from proposed retention basin would infiltrate and recharge the Santa Margarita Sandstone Aquifer, and has significant potential to recharge the Lompico Sandstone Aquifer. A concern has been raised regarding the impact of the buttress fill project upon the potential transmissivity (permeability) of the retention basin. It appears that the buttress fill project utilized a finer grain material. The finer grain material when accompanied by required compaction efforts may have adversely impacted the transmissivity of the soils in the area proposed for the retention basin thereby reducing permeability. Manager Mueller provided the Board with a copy of the letter of response asking for additional investigation prior to filing a Negative Declaration. Dir. Prather inquired on the liability of Hansen Aggregates to remedy the problem. Legal Counsel Hynes stated that there would be no liability on Hansen's part because they received the permit from the County. Dir. Rapoza directed staff to contact Hansen staff and schedule a site tour for the week of August 18, 2003.
