### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended the Committee members review and discuss the attached Fire Recovery Surcharge revenue & expense tracking and discuss with staff any additions or changes they would like to see to the report.

#### BACKGROUND:

The CZU Complex Lightening Fires created extensive damage to District facilities. An emergency event such as this is unexpected and can cause an immediate and long-term financial strain on the District. The District is working with FEMA to recover approximately 75% of the project costs, however, the District will need to cover the remaining 25%. At this time the estimated project costs are over \$20M. This means the District is expecting to owe \$5M. To date, we have submitted \$1.3M to FEMA for reimbursement.

At the August 5, 2021 Board meeting, the Board held a Proposition 218 hearing and adopted the Fire Recovery Surcharge. The Board has directed staff that any surcharge revenues are to be placed in a restricted account to pay for Wildfire recovery and repairs only. The District will track its Wildfire costs against the revenues generated by the surcharge on an ongoing basis. The surcharge as proposed would end automatically upon collection of the estimated \$5 million, which would occur after approximately 5 years. However, if the District's actual costs are lower than expected, the Board could reduce or terminate the surcharge early without conducting another Proposition 218 process.

The attached Fire Recovery Surcharge revenue & expense tracking is a draft and can be developed along the way with Committee input and as we start to receive funding through FEMA.
